The Eurométropole de Strasbourg, a European capital committed to its mobility revolution, is delighted to welcome you in 2024!

Cutting-edge public transport

- A tram system celebrating 30 years of service, in constant expansion, with 15 additional kilometres to be added by 2027.
- France's first Metropolitan Regional Express Service (SERM), outside of Paris, in cooperation with the Région Grand Est.
- → 300 km of commercial bus routes
- Over **492,000 trips** / days

A range of services for choosing your mobility

- 184,000 public transport season-ticket holders, 70% of whom benefit from solidarity fares or free travel (for under-18s)
- Flexhop, on-demand transport service over the whole of the territory, with more than 4500 trips per week
- Vélhop, bike-hire service, with 6000 bikes available throughout the Eurométropole (including 1400 ebikes)
- → Pioneer territory with 75 carpool stations and 55 free-floating vehicles



- → Over 700 km of cycle tracks
- A Bicycle Plan with more than
 €100 million invested
- Grants of €150 to €500 for purchasing an ebike
- → 16,500 participants (875 businesses) and some 2,000,000 km ridden in the Au Boulot À Vélo (Ride a Bike to Work) challenge in 2024.

With over 11,000 attendees and 60 countries taking part, European Mobility Expo is the key international event for all stakeholders in mobilities (including manufacturers, operators, institutions, startups and service providers). ←→ From the airport (10 km from the city centre): Take the TER shuttle train and be in the centre in 8 minutes.




Where is the Expo?


